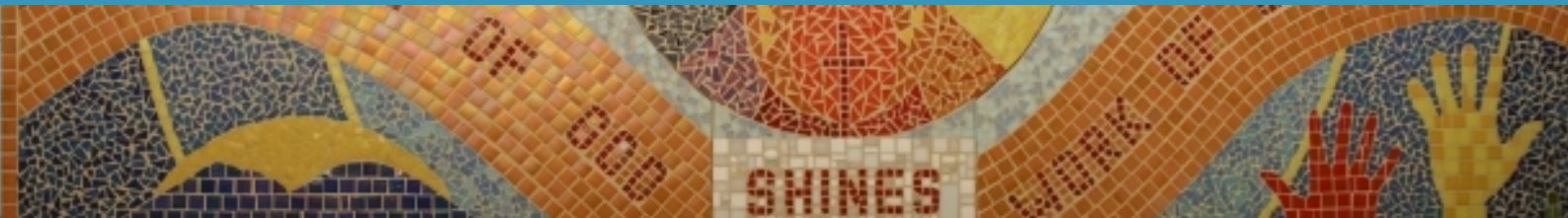


### OUR PUMPKIN CARVING WINNERS

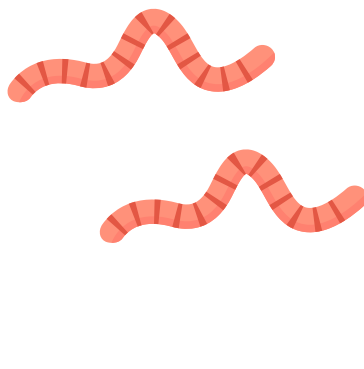

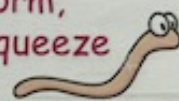


## WORRY WORMS

## CHILDREN IN NEED

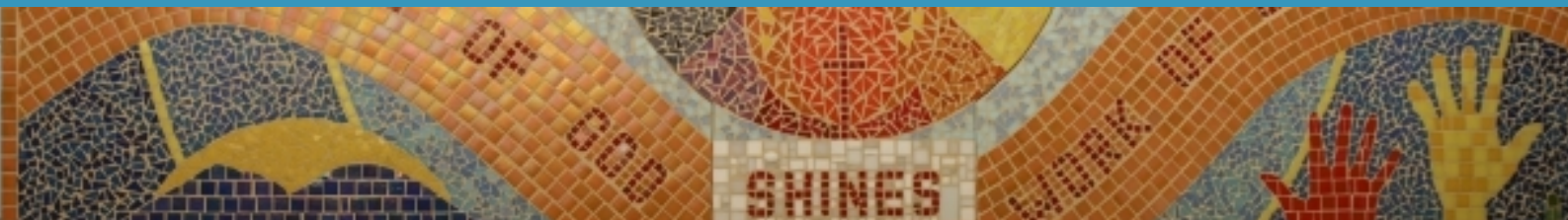

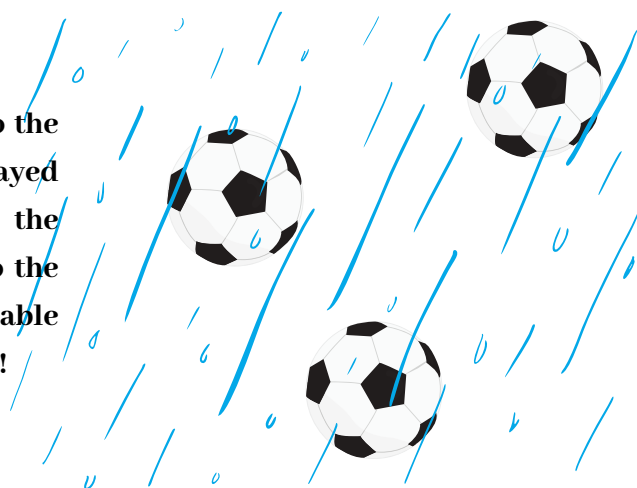
Thank you to those children that have returned their posters for the Forrester's colouring competition. Entries need to be returned by November 9th.



## FOOTBALL

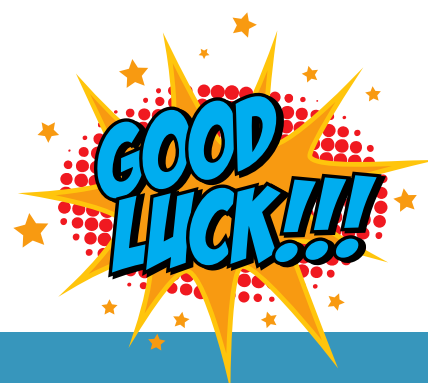


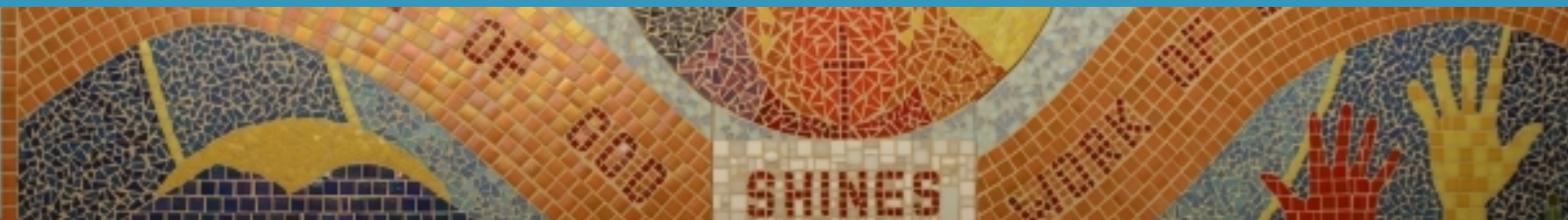
