We are a church school where education is nourished through the teachings of Jesus Christ, enabling each child to fulfil their potential and which reflects our commitment to academic excellence.

Religious Education

Intent:

We believe that every child is unique at Norley and this is reflected within our mission statement: ***The love of God shines through us by the work of our hands.*** Religious Education at Norley CE is an integral part of the children's education, with emphasis based upon respect for each other, of the local and wider community. We engage our children's curiosity through exploring the study of the Christian Faith, other Faiths and Beliefs, so as to promote their personal, spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.

We want children to:

- To know about and understand Christianity as a diverse global living faith through the exploration of core beliefs using an approach that critically engages with biblical text.
- To gain knowledge and understanding of a range of religions and worldviews appreciating diversity, continuity and change within the religions and worldviews being studied.
- To engage with challenging questions of meaning and purpose raised by human existence and experience.
- To recognise the concept of religion and its continuing influence on Britain's cultural heritage and in the lives of individuals and societies in different times, cultures and places.
- To explore their own religious, spiritual and philosophical ways living, believing and thinking.

Implementation:

The skills which are developed through a sequence of lessons enable the children to build upon their knowledge and allow for progression throughout the school. Religious Education is taught on a weekly basis, and is sometimes delivered through a class topic or as a whole-school RE day. Christian values are celebrated within the classroom ethos, throughout school and during our whole school collective worship. We welcome our local church in weekly and to celebrate the events within the church calendar providing the children with the opportunity to recognise the importance of the wider Christian community.

Lessons are planned and delivered in a variety of ways ensuring that all children can access and participate in lessons. Interactive, practical activities encourage the children to discuss their ideas and extend their understanding of difficult concepts and challenging questions.

Pupils' progress in RE is based on the expected outcomes outlined in the Questful RE, the syllabus we use, supplemented by Understanding Christianity, which in turn, have been developed in line with guidance produced nationally. Religious Education is a statutory subject which is reported to parents at the end of the year.

Impact:

The structure of the RE curriculum ensures the children have the opportunity to be consistent and build upon previous skills and knowledge. The children access a varied program of study. All the children have the opportunity to interpret and respond in a personal and respectful way to the RE being taught. Here, the children can express and refine initial ideas, develop further their understanding and answer questions critically, in order to produce work of a high standard, which is valued and celebrated throughout school.
